Saksham Trust is a National award-winning NGO founded in 2003 by Mr Dipendra Manocha and Ms Rummi K. Seth. We believe that every person with visual impairment and low vision deserves the best chance for a bright future and we work to make sure they have these opportunities to thrive throughout their life. To turn this vision into a reality, we run programmes in the field of inclusive education, assistive technology, accessible books and cultural inclusion. Our Founders, Mr. Dipendra Manocha and Ms. Rummi K. Seth were driven to set up Saksham Trust with a

belief that persons with visual impairment or low vision can do everything with only one change – the way things are done.

This powerful belief has since then led Saksham, Trust to establish centres in Delhi, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh. Saksham school In Noida and Jalandhar works for the empowerment and education of children with visual impairment and multiple disabilities.

In 2017, our technology-providing arm – Saktek Foundation – was launched to further our belief that power of technology can redefine what persons with disabilities can or cannot do.

OFF TO SCHOOL: OUR NEW PREPARATORY SCHOOL FOR VI CHILDREN IN JALANDHAR

We have wonderful news for you! It gives us great pleasure to share that we recently inaugurated the Saksham Resource Center in Jalandhar, Punjab in August 2022. We would like to make a special mention of Dr. Vinod Pal, who is associated with Niti Aayog. He has been one of our strongest pillars of support in the process of getting the Saksham Jalandhar Resource Center up and running. Ms. Seema Chopra graciously presided over the inauguration ceremony as a special guest. She has had a long history of engagement with social work in the disability sector in Punjab.



The center has been established with the aim to provide both academic and non-academic support to young children with visual impairment and multiple disabilities. Students are provided pre-integration training to help them gain skills such as orientation and mobility, reading-writing and computer and assistive technology skills, that ensure their smooth integration in mainstream schools right from the start.

Training can last from 6 months to about a year, depending on the students' current skill level, and grade level at school. We have provisions to train a small cohort of students. All students are given individual attention corresponding to their individual needs and skill level. Folks with school-aged children who are visually impaired or multiply disabled, who live in or near Jalandhar are welcome to contact the Saksham Jalandhar Resource Center for further information or guidance.




NEWLY LAUNCHED PRODUCTS BY SAKSHAM

Sound Football

There are several recreational and leisure options available for persons with visual impairment. Therefore, people with visual impairment can enjoy a wide variety of activities, one of them being Football.

Blind football is a 5-a-side game with four players and one goalkeeper

The ball has got little bells inside and doesn't fly around. The bells allow the players to be guided towards the ball.



Geometry Kit With Box

A box containing instruments with tactile marking enabling a person with blindness to construct figures easily

Geometry box consisting of plastic scale, setsquares, compass and protractor having tactile marking that enable a person with blindness to construct figures accurately



Universal Braille Kit

The Braille Kit is designed to teach braille to blind children. The Universal Braille Kit has a braille cube, an alphabet plate, a braille slate and stylus, a standard abacus and instruction manuals.

It is a basic solution to enable any literate person, preferably the parents, to impart braille based basic literacy to the blind child, even at home and even at the pre-school stage. It comprises of devices designed to help the blind to learn to form braille letters, words and sentences, write, learn normal handwriting, basic arithmatics and drawing.





Digital India Week 2022



It was a proud moment indeed when Honourable Prime Minister Narendra Modi met our student Reema at the exhibition organised during Digital India Week 2022 in July. Reema explained how Tactile diagrams created by Raised Lines Foundation (RLF) help her understand visual concepts of Science, Math and Economics.

Reema described some features of the tactile diagrams to Modi ji, like different textures used to denote different colours in the Indian flag and the map of India. She shared how she finds the tactile representations immensely helpful in understanding different visual concepts, and she attributes her 84% score in class 10th to facilities like these, which helped her compete on equal terms with her sighted peers.

Reema presented the honourable Prime Minister with a tactile photo of himself, and Modi ji gave her his blessings. Reema is a class 12 student studying in Bal Bharati Public School, which is a mainstream school in Noida. Reema is late-blind, and additionally belongs to a low-income family. She has made great strides in learning accessibility and independence skills at the Saksham resource centre in Noida after her vision loss, and now looks forward to enroll in a reputed BBA program after she finishes high school.

26th April



23rd June, 2022



A training was successfully provided to 14 students with visual impairment from Janki Devi Memorial College, Delhi University on fundamental computer applications like MS office, internet, typing etc







A workshop was organized for visually challenged employees of Punjab and Sind Bank to make them aware about latest AT solutions for workplace.



AWARENESS, TRAINING WORKSHOPS & EXPERIENCE ZONE

Saksham Tek Fiesta - Shimla

14th - 15th August, 2022

Saksham organised a two-day Tek Fiesta on the 14th and 15th of August to inaugurate our newest resource center in Shimla. We set up an experience zone containing many of our assistive technology solutions, intended as a one-stop spot for persons with visual impairments and/or their allies to try their hand at all the available assistive tech in order to make an informed choice about the products that will best suit their needs. Another landmark event of the Tek Fiesta was the lightning training component, conducted by trainers from Saksham Delhi, focusing on the use of three devices: laptops, DAISY players, and Android phones. The training sessions (conducted like accelerated crash courses) were jam-packed with useful information about the various functions of the three devices already mentioned. Twenty persons among the attendees (chosen by lucky draw) who had registered for the subsidy scheme received a laptop, DAISY player, or an Android phone, based on their indicated preference. An additional lucky draw was organised, wherein lucky winners also received a talking pulse oximeter for free.







AWARENESS, TRAINING WORKSHOPS & EXPERIENCE ZONE

Saksham Tek Fiesta - Jalandhar

17th to 18th November 2022

A 2-day Tek Fiesta was organized at Lovely Professional University in Jalandhar from 17th to 18th of November 2022. On the first day of this event, a sensitization workshop was organized with the students of the university in which the students enthusiastically participated and challenged persons experienced how visually overcome impediments that they face in their day to day life with the help of assistive solutions. The second day of the event comprised of trainings on the use of various functions and applications of reading writing devices like laptops, android phones and daisy players, along with the experience zone of assistive devices where persons with blindness and print disability could try out various solutions and make an informed choice about which technology would be most suitable for meeting their specific needs. The visually challenged users also got an opportunity to procure the required solution in an affordable manner during this event, and 11 persons were provided laptops, daisy players and android tablets as per their requirement free of charge, all of who were shortlisted by means of a lucky draw.

Saksham Resource Centre News

Education & Rehabilitation Of Children With Visual Impairment, Deaf-blindness & Multiple Disability

Saksham has been working to ensure the development of skills of her visually impaired children. During the reporting period, teachers of the resource centers went to public spaces like shopping malls to create awareness about the various interventions of Saksham and also as an effort to raise funds. Awareness was also created through social media, websites and reference of parents, rehabilitation professionals, well-wishers, teachers, and staff. 10 inquiries on admission was received.



Developing Skills for Independent Living

Social skill development is built into the Individualized Educational Plan for children with Visual impairment or Visually impaired children with multi-sensory Impairment across all age groups. Children participated in celebrating Eid and Hellen Keller's Day

Capacity building of special educators (in-house), mainstream teachers, and parents

- PTM 120 parents were brought up to date with progress of their child.
- NIOS Accreditation- 7 children continued their education through NIOS
- Workshop Nest making workshop-15children were present in offline mode and another 10 children were present in online mode.
- Maths teaching workshop-15 teachers participated 21 children received a reading stand
- In-house teacher's meeting 20 teachers participated in the meeting.





Developing Skills for Independent Living

- 100 students were trained in Daily living skills.
- 50 junior ACA students were trained in Orientation and mobility.
- 23 children received therapy for Motor development.
- 90 students were trained in Communication skills.

SAKSHAM'S RESPONSE TO THE ACCESSIBLE BOOK FAMINE

Saksham Library is largely working on educational contents, Higher education books and school text books. Most of the books converted during the period of July to September are books requested directly by end users. Saksham has involved person with different abilities to be part of book conversion process. Amogh an NGO from Banglore is taking lead in training people with special abilities like Dyslexic, Mental Retardation, Autism, Mild Intellectual disability, wheelchair users etc who have challenges in finding a job and travelling to workplace for proofreading work.

Now Amogh in partnership with Saksham has trained more than 65 such candidates and all are working for creating accessible contents for blind persons. This partnership is going on for last 2 years.



7138 Books have been uploaded to Sugamya Pustakalaya, our online library so far with 3899 users regularly accessing the books

All the books are educational contents from state board, private publisher books and books used in higher education.

HARPER COLLINS

Saksham has tie-up with Publisher Harper Collins India Pvt Ltd, and the publisher is sharing their contents for making it available for blind students. Saksham successfully completed conversion of 75 titles of grade 1 to grade 8 and uploaded to sugamya pustakalaya

UP BOARD TEXTBOOKS

With the support of Sight Savers, UNICEF has given Saksham the opportunity to convert UP Board textbooks of grade 1 to 8 into accessible format. 61 titles of UP Board textbooks were converted into accessible format.

This project was done in collaboration with UNICEF and Sightsavers. The UP board text books of grade 1 to Grade 8 were converted to accessible format by Saksham. This project also started in last financial year and completed by June 2022.

Training conducted with Amogh

Training with Amogh was conducted on 29th November with all project heads and compilers. Following topics were convered during this training:

- 1. Formatting guidelines to be followed in docx file
- 2. Process of converting word to Epub file
- 3. How to test Epub file using ACE validator so that error free accessible EPUB files can be created

Now Amogh in partnership with Saksham has trained more than **65 such candidates** and all are working for creating accessible contents for blind persons. This partnership is going on for last 2 years.





On-going Projects

Accessible Book conversion supported by Ford Foundation:

Under this project we have to convert 15000 pages of EPub with proofreading and 200000 pages of EPub without proofreading. The project timeline was till Nov 2022 and got extension till March 2023. The activities are going on and we will be able to finish the commitment within the extended timeline

- 1. Accessible Book Project Supported by Essel Foundation: 34000 pages of print book needs to be converted to accessible digital format. We have completed 26000 pages till now and uploaded to Sugamya Pustakalaya
- 2. Accessible Book Conversion supported by Enable India: 49000 pages needs to be converted under this project to accessible digital format. We have completed around 20,000 pages.
- 3. Accessible Book conversion supported By ICREON: ICREON supported to setup physical library with laptop, smartphone, RBD, Scanner, and braille books in 2018 and from there on supported for accessible digital books. This year they have supported for 7200 pages. We have completed 5000 pages till now.

Types of books converted using above project:

We have converted books from following boards/courses into accessible format:

- 1. UP board text books of class 1 to 8th in Hindi medium.
- 2. English medium text books from publisher Harper Collins of grade 1 to 8
- 3. Various courses of IGNOU university in which blind studetns are enrolled like material production and distribution division 1 and 2, tourism studies, Master of Arts etc..
- 4. Text books from Himachal Board
- 5. Reference books used in Delhi University different courses of MA and BA
- 6.Reference materials used for UPSC exams
